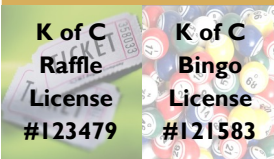

council plays a major role in Gibault – we have donated thousands of dollars and many hours; currently, we proudly have two of our very own Knights involved with Gibault – our Gibault Envoy and a member of the Gibault Board of Directors.

Locally, our council is second to none in modeling the way in CHARITY. Our Knights and their families have done so much for our church, our community, and one another. A summary of our CHARITY includes: St. Vincent De-
